# **Economic Highlights**

Real GDP (2013) = \$58.5 billion (4.8% increase)

GDP/Capita (2012) = \$52,367/capita

Exports/Capita (2014) = \$31,149/capita

Exports as a % of Real GDP = 67%

Unemployment Rate (April 2014) =3.7%

### Saskatchewan – Our Strengths

### **Agriculture:**

- Saskatchewan is home to over 44% of Canada's total cultivated farmland with nearly 26 million hectares
- Agriculture exports from Saskatchewan are valued at over \$11.1 billion (2012)
- World's top exporter of green lentils, chickpeas, mustard and canary seed
- Agriculture exports leading Canadian 13 agri-food products
- Largest agriculture exporter among Canadian provinces







### **Saskatchewan – Our Strengths**

### Mining:

- Largest potash producer, supplying 30% of the world's trade in potash and has up to 50% of the known reserves
- Second largest uranium producer, supplying 20% of global production
- Home to many ancillary services developed to support the mining industry







### **Saskatchewan – Our Strengths**

### Oil & Gas:

- Saskatchewan accounts for 28% of the country's primary energy production, the highest of all provinces in Canada
- Saskatchewan is the second largest oil producer in Canada
- Saskatchewan is the third largest producer of natural gas and coal in Canada
- Oil and gas accounts for 17% of Saskatchewan's GDP





### **Saskatchewan – Our Strengths**

### Manufacturing:

- \$8.5 billion in manufacturing exports in 2012
- Export 75% of the manufactured goods produced in the province
- Leading manufacturer of dryland farming equipment and technology and contract manufactured goods







### **Other Key Saskatchewan Exports and Industry**

- Agriculture Biotechnology (animal genetics, R & D services, etc.)
- Agri-Food (food ingredients, food, livestock, natural, organic)
- **Primary and Secondary Building Products** (lumber, OSB, kitchen cabinets, millwork)
- OEM/Custom Fabrication (components, parts, metal structures)
- Transportation Equipment (trailers, ambulances, specialty vehicles)
- Energy & Mining (products/services to support these industries)
- Environmental Products and Technologies (remediation technologies, wind power, filtration products)
- Information and Communications Technologies (software, telecommunications equipment)
- Professional Services (architects, management consulting)
- Education/Training (universities and technical institutes, private training)
- Consumer Products (art, jewelry, apparel, lawn/garden products)
- Tourism in Saskatchewan



# Largest per capita exporting province



# Where Saskatchewan Exported in 2014 (Top 10)








