Miyazaki Beef

Mango

Miyazaki Prefecture

Miyazaki in Kyushu, close to East Asia

Miyazaki Prefecture is in the southeastern part of Kyushu, with many areas facing the Pacific Ocean. The prefecture is also located in the center of East Asian Economic Zone, which is currently growing strongly.

Regular flights operate from Miyazaki Airport to Seoul and Taipei and from Kagoshima Airport in adjacent Kagoshima Prefecture to Shanghai. Miyazaki's three key ports - Hososhima Port, Miyazaki Port and Aburatsu Port - function as the bases for the distribution of goods to cities in Japan and overseas.

•Population

Miyazaki Prefecture has a population of approximately 1.13 million, equivalent to about 1% of the national population. Of these, about 480,000 people live in Miyazaki City, the center of politics, commerce and culture of the prefecture, and its vicinity. In addition, the Miyakonojo area has a population of about 240,000 and the Nobeoka/Hyuga area has a population of about 220,000. The population distribution in the prefecture is well balanced among several urban areas.

•Climate

Thanks to its mild climate with the third warmest annual average temperature in Japan, the prefecture is a pleasant place to live throughout the year.

Miyazaki is also known as a sport-friendly prefecture because professional baseball teams including the Yomiuri Giants and Fukuoka SoftBank Hawks and many other sports teams conduct training camps here, with the Dunlop Phoenix Tournament, a men's golf tournament well known as the richest in Japan, also being held in the prefecture.

The prefecture enjoys the third most hours of sunshine and the third highest number of sunny days in Japan. Forests growing under plenty of sunshine occupy about 76% of the land area of the prefecture. Miyazaki Prefecture is recognized as a "sunny and green land."

Transportation System

Accessibility to transport is one of Miyazaki's key points as a business location. Miyazaki Prefecture is convenient for transporting both people and goods to headquarters in Japan and bases overseas.

For access to cities in Japan, there are 16 shuttle flights (90 minutes each way) a day between Miyazaki and Tokyo (Haneda), 9 shuttle flights (60 minutes each way) a day between Miyazaki and Osaka (Itami) and 3 shuttle flights (70 minutes each way) a day between Miyazaki and Nagoya (Chubu Centrair International). These services enable passengers to travel between Miyazaki and metropolitan areas in a relatively short time, so that one-day business trips to these areas are possible.

For access to cities abroad, regular flights operate from Miyazaki Airport to Seoul and Taipei, and from Kagoshima Airport in adjacent Kagoshima Prefecture to Shanghai. You can easily access the East Asian Economic Zone, which is now growing strongly.

By flying via the international hub airport Incheon International Airport (Seoul), where many flights arrive from, and depart for many cities, you can access the world from Miyazaki.
