



Educated Workforce

Miyagi has a diverse pool of highly skilled, educated and reliable workers. It has a proven track record in successfully providing skilled workers for a wide range of industries including manufacturing and knowledge-intensive service sectors.

Miyagi is home to a variety of higher education institutions – 14 universities, several junior and technical colleges, and vocational schools. Universities offer a complete range of programs in arts and sciences as well as graduate and professional programs. Among them, Tohoku University has diverse and rigorous programs backed by world-class research facilities, focusing on nurturing Japan's next generation of scientists, researchers and entrepreneurs. Tohoku University continues to attract students from all over the world.

Furthermore, technical colleges and vocational schools provide more specific, practical and job-related training. These schools collaborate closely with Miyagi-based businesses and industries to develop training courses that meet existing and future needs. Workers in Miyagi have solid and practical skills you can rely on, which ultimately lead to lower training costs.

Miyagi's People and Culture

Miyagi's unique culture promotes a business-friendly environment that values hard work and professionalism. Miyagi's workforce is characterized by relatively young and eager workers with a strong work ethic and low turnover. Miyagi's workforce has superior levels of productivity and the typical wage rates are significantly lower than those in Tokyo and the national average, which enables further cost-savings.




In terms of cost competitiveness, demand opportunities and growth potential, Miyagi offers a variety of attractive benefits while also being a gateway to Japan's dynamic, developed economy and markets.

In comparison with other investment destinations across the country, Miyagi offers a highly competitive average wage as well as a cost-friendly investment base. Miyagi-based corporations benefit from the prefecture's low wage average and abundance of eager and well-trained young job seekers.

Miyagi's land prices are also highly competitive. In 2011, the cost of industrial and residential land was among the lowest in Japan and continues to remain lower than average.

Miyagi offers a range of attractive incentives to businesses establishing and expanding operations in the prefecture, with special additional investment benefits also now available.

Miyagi is committed to helping companies identify the best incentives for their particular industry. A dedicated team is ready to provide advice on how to maximize available benefits, at both a national and local level.

Special Investment Zones

Special investment zones have been created as destinations for new investment, offering an extremely beneficial environment backed by substantial incentives. These special zones are exclusive to the North East region of Japan, including Miyagi. Investors may enjoy waivers on land use and simplified approval procedures, tax breaks and financial backing - among other benefits.

Investment Incentives for New Businesses

Miyagi offers a range of beneficial tax incentives, focused on promoting the establishment of new businesses. The following business areas have been selected as target sectors for growth in Miyagi: autos, clean energy, high tech electronics, medical equipment / life science, aerospace, shipping, food, lumber and ICT.

Various Investment Benefits

- A range of subsidies on fixed asset investments for new facilities, equipment, R&D for manufacturing and IT (dependent on location, amount of financial investment and jobs created)
- Subsidies for the establishment and expansion of freight transport and warehouse distribution centers
- New fixed asset investment subsidies as well as office and equipment rentals for ICT companies

Special Benefits Offered by Municipalities

- Sendai City offers subsidies for manufacturing, R&D facilities, call center / back office facilities, data center, software businesses, content-creation businesses and leisure-related facilities
- Job creation grants available

Incentives for Renewable Energy Projects

- Feed-in-tariff
- Subsidies for power facility installment and introduction of smart energy systems



Among other life science projects, Tohoku University has collaborated with various industries on research to better understand and identify Alzheimer's disease in its early stages and played a key role in the development of the Tohoku Medical Megabank Organization which was created after the March 2011 earthquake to support healthcare throughout the recovery areas.

With a strong entrepreneurial culture, Tohoku University's collaborations with various industries have led to innovative scientific discoveries and the development of new products and improved services.



Tokyo Electron Ltd.

Tokyo Electron has a long standing relationship with Tohoku University dating back to the late 1990s. More recently, Tokyo Electron worked with the Center for Spintronics Integrated Systems at Tohoku University to jointly develop spintronics memory, a new technology attracting a great deal of interest for power-saving in next generation electronic devices.



SANOFI Sanofi K.K.

In 2011, Sanofi and Tohoku University entered into a three-year comprehensive collaboration agreement to evaluate life science programs based on their market potential and exchange ideas and opinions through a joint research committee.



GE Healthcare

GE Healthcare selected Tohoku University and Clino Ltd., a biotechnology venture, as its partner in a research collaboration to seek innovative breakthroughs in the treatment of Alzheimer's disease. This partnership will lead to developing new ways to diagnose Alzheimer's symptoms and to potentially treat the disease far sooner.

Founded in 1997, Cyber Solutions is now recognized as one of the region's most exciting ICT venture businesses. Through its enticing investment incentives and benefits, Miyagi is seeking to encourage development in a variety of fast-growing industries.






















Setting Up Business in Japan
