StartX's Flagship is held 3 times per year, and approximately 3 training courses are conducted in line with each Flagship opening period.





ENTRY | Requirements & Criteria



Requirements

Must meet all requirements 1-5 and agree to the terms and conditions

- 1. Japan-based startup.
- 2. Actively planning global expansion or fundraising.
- 3. Business-level English proficiency (required for directors/global leads).
- 4. Only Founder can participate in all programs.
- 5. Agreement to <u>program terms</u>, <u>online program conditions</u> and postprogram surveys.

Notes

- Past participants of Startup City Acceleration Program or Global Startup Acceleration Program may apply.
- Data might be shared with Cabinet Office, METI, and partner accelerators.

Selection Criteria

Applications reviewed by StartX and JETRO based on submitted materials. Finalists may be invited for interviews. No status inquiries accepted.

- 1. Team expertise, network, and language skills.
- 2. Product/service growth potential and market fit.
- 3. Alignment between course content and business goals.

Costs

- ◆ JETRO covers
- Program fees
- Flagship program Tuition (only for selectees)
- ◆ Participant covers
- Program-related communication fees
- All other non-JETRO-covered expenses
- Flagship program travel and accommodation at Palo Alto if you decide to stay in SF
- U.S. entry costs (ESTA/VISA/insurance etc...)

The following both items must be submitted to complete your entry.



◆ English Pitch Deck (10 slides max, PDF/PPT) including:

√Product/service (problem solved + solution)

✓Past achievements and future plans

√Business model, market size, competitive advantage

√Team background (include founders' LinkedIn profiles)
