Notification of Department of Industrial Works

Re: Prescribing fine for violation of industrial waste disposal that are not in compliance with the Ministerial Notification issued pursuant to the Factory Act B.E.2535 (1992)

To protect the environment from pollution generated from factory operation, a factory entrepreneur shall realize the significance of standard concerning any pollution that may have an impact on the environment which results in nuisance and safety of the public living nearby a factory and shall be strictly in compliance with the law.

Department of Industrial Works hereby implements a policy in setting up fine rate for a factory that takes its industrial waste out of premise to treat or disposal with the methods or procedures that are not coherent with standard under the Ministerial Notification. The fine rate shall be prescribed as shown in the list annexed hereto.

List 1: Industrial waste under the Ministerial Notification No.1 (B.E.2541 (1998))
Section 1: Non-hazardous waste

Description	Fine rate (Baht)
1. Dumping of industrial wastes to public place or other places without approval from Department of Industrial Works	20,000 – 200,000
2. Taking waste out of factory premise to treat and disposed of in a place that approved by Department of Industrial Works, but has no permit of offsite waste treatment.	10,000 – 200,000

List 2: Industrial waste under the Ministerial Notification No.1 (B.E.2541 (1998))
Section 2: waste from specific production process
Or Industrial waste under the Ministerial Notification No.6 (B.E.2540 (1997))

Description	Fine rate (Baht)
1. Dumping of industrial wastes to public place or other places without approval from Department of Industrial Works	50,000 – 200,000
2. Taking waste out of factory premise to treat and disposed of in a place that approved by Department of Industrial Works, but has no permit of offsite waste treatment.	25,000 – 200,000

Remark: If a violator is legal entity, both legal entity and every authorized person for such legal entity shall be subjected to fine at the same rate.
