



Events in Japan

1. Japan-China-Korea Industrial Fair 2008 in Osaka

From June 18th-20th, JETRO, together with the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT) and the Korea Trade-Investment Promotion Agency (KOTRA), held the "Japan-China-Korea Industrial Fair 2008" in Osaka.

The event, which included an exhibition, symposium and business missions, aimed to promote business alliances among firms in the three countries, and enhanced cooperation in the fields of the environment and energy-saving, thereby contributing to furthering development in East Asia.

This year's event focused on the promotion of cooperation in the environment and energy-saving fields, based on the agreements made at the Japan-China and Japan-Korea summit meetings in December 2007, April 2008, and May 2008. The event marked the first step towards generating actual business among the three countries in these fields.

The exhibition showcased the products and services of 324 firms/organizations from the three countries (100 from Japan, 119 from China, and 105 from Korea) in such sectors as the environment and energy-saving, electric/electronics, general machinery, transportation machinery, IT, medical and welfare equipment, functional food, textile and more.

About one third of the exhibition's "Japan Pavilion" participants displayed their environment and energy-saving technology. The highlight of the pavilion is "Eliica," the world's fastest lithium-ion battery car that runs at 370 km/hour.

The "Osaka Kansai Pavilion", part of the Japan Pavilion, featured 40 firms from the Kansai area. Among them, six major firms presented technologies and products reflecting their strong commitment to the global environment and well being of future generations under the title, "Osaka-Kansai Environmental Solutions Showcase." On Wednesday, June 18th, a symposium entitled "Advancing Corporate Strategies in Japan, China and Korea in the New Era" were held at Hyatt Regency Osaka, examining future business alliances among the three countries. The symposium featured a keynote speech by Mr. Yotaro Kobayashi, Chief Corporate Advisor at Fuji Xerox Co., Ltd., and presentations and panel discussions by representatives from major firms in the three countries: Sony, Suntech Power and Posco.

2. African Fair 2008

The Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) and the Japan External Trade Organization (JETRO) jointly organized several activities in conjunction with the 4th Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD IV), which was held in Yokohama this May 28th- 30th.

The largest event was "African Fair 2008" (May 28th-June 1st), in which 42 African nations will exhibit a range of unique and attractive products under the theme, "Vibrant Africa" a Continent of Business Opportunities," which was proposed by the African Diplomatic Corps in Japan.

The fair's JETRO Zone introduced several African products (shea butter, cut flowers, etc.) that are making inroads into the Japan market and have been supported by JETRO programs.

Other special areas/features of the fair included: 1) **"Japanese Company Zone**," introducing the activities of several Japanese firms in Africa; 2) **"style AFRICA**," displaying African products in a model room setting, showing how they can match Japanese lifestyles; and

3) **Organization Booths**, introducing efforts by various international and Japanese organizations aimed at supporting African development, including "One Village One Product" campaigns focused on Africa, under the Japanese government's "New Development Initiative for Trade."

Another major official event being held in conjunction with TICAD IV is "Africa Symposium", which METI and JETRO organized together with the World Bank, also in Yokohama, on May 29th.

Inviting dignitaries from Africa and Japan as well as prominent business figures from around the globe, the symposium examined Africa's recent growth trends and discuss ways for achieving sustainable growth and shifting economic structures away from over-reliance on natural resources. The event also examined ways private companies can contribute to Africa's development through Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) activities.



Exploring Japan

Introduction of Pocketbook entitled "Let's Have a Health Check Up for Retail Shop"

In 2006, JETRO Bangkok, together with the Business Development Department of the Commerce Ministry, the Thai Chamber of Commerce and the Technology Promotion Association (Thailand-Japan), in order to develop human resource for commercial diagnosis, hosted a training of "Commercial Diagnosis Basics (For Retail Business)" and modified a textbook called "A Guide to Commercial Diagnosis (For Retail Business)" to be pocketbook entitled "Let's Have a Health Check Up for Retail Shop". The textbook modification is a part of the campaign to publicize knowledge about retail business diagnosis to retailers. The retailers will be able to apply the guidelines as well as the means of diagnosis to improve the management and boost efficiency of their retail business.
